The HME Market By The Numbers

Bidding reverberates through data

HERE WAS A big change to the HME industry in 2013: Round 2 of competitive bidding, which went into effect in 91 cities on July 1, 2013. It was associated with double-digit cuts to reimbursement for a wide range of home medical equipment.

With that for context, it's no surprise that a lot of the data points that we track in the State of the Industry Report show marked decreases for 2013.

When we look at BETOS (see p. 4), for example, we see fairly significant reductions in allowed charges for oxygen and supplies, wheelchairs, and other DME. The total allowed charges across product categories was \$5.3 billion in 2013 compared to \$8.1 billion in 2012.

For a product category like wheelchairs, the changes to reimbursement driven by competitive bidding were coupled with a demonstration project in seven states requiring prior authorizations starting July 1, 2013;

and The Scooter Store, the largest provider of power wheelchairs, closing its doors in the fall of 2013.

When you look at allowed charges on a code level (see p. 6), there was a 56% decrease in allowed charges for K0823, the most popular standard power wheelchair. Total allowed charges were \$133,239,857 for this code in 2013.

This somewhat toxic environment probably has something to do with an overall decrease in the number of HME providers billing Medicare in 2013 (see p. 5). In years past, we've seen some bumps in the number of providers billing Medicare in the \$3 million to

\$10 million, and the \$10 million-plus categories. Not this year.

In addition to Round 2, CMS also pushed a mail-order program for diabetes supplies nationwide on July 1, 2013. As part of this program, CMS doled out contracts to less than 20 providers; reduced reimbursement, on average, by 72%; and set off a surge in M&A activity as providers jockeyed for contracts.

This change reverberated through several data points in the State of the Industry Report. If you look at the list of top providers in 2013 (see p. 11), you'll see the debut of Arriva Medical, one of the companies making the most acquisitions in the diabetes market amid all the change. You'll also see Liberty Medical, which filed for bankruptcy in February of 2013, dropped from No. 4 to No. 9.

Additionally, if you look at allowed charges on a code level (see p. 10), you'll see there was a 50% decrease in

allowed charges for A4259, lancets, and a 42% decrease for A4253, blood glucose strips. There was an 85% increase in allowed charges for E0607, blood glucose monitors, which have not been included in the mail-order program.

It will be interesting to see if, in the next few years, as these changes become the new normal for the HME industry, the data starts to stabilize or, hopefully, move in the opposite direction.

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


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

What is a BETOS bucket?

BETOS STANDS FOR BERENSON-EGGERS TYPE OF SERVICE, and it's the name of a coding system developed to analyze the growth in Medicare expenditures. The coding system covers all HCPCS codes; assigns a HCPCS code to only one BETOS bucket; consists of readily understood clinical categories that permit objective assignment; is stable over time; and is relatively immune to minor changes in technology or practice patterns.
